## World War 1

History has a strange way of coming full circle– Brenda Weaver called me and asked if I would serve on a museum group called "Worth Remembering". I said I would, now guess what our first project was? Finding stories and decedants of what went on during World War 1. Now mind you we are running out of people who served in World War II and Korean War.

My first thought was, I know nobody that served, knew of no stories, and the Brethren were the last people interested in bearing arms.

Out of the blue comes the Messenger, our church publication, with a six page article of the treatment of the Brethren who were CO's (Conscientious Objectors) were subject to imprisonment, beaten, shackled and jailed.

Excerpts from the article in the Messenger (June 2017):

It is sometimes forgotten that in the lead-up to the First World War, a large proportion of Americans were against that bloody and pointless contest between European Powers. Brethren, Mennonites and Friends who were drafted were persecuted, tortured, and even killed because they refused to take up arms."

Worst of all Brethren were failed by their leadership. A special Annual Meeting was held January 1918 in Goshen, Indiana. A strong statement outlined in the biblical Brethren beliefs on war with a refusal to participate in any way. The government of the United States countered with a threat to arrest Brethren leaders unless they repudiated the statement. The response of the Brethren leaders who signed the Goshen Statement was to repudiate the statement.

-Original Goshen Statement-

"We further wage our Brethren not to enlist in any service which would, in any way, compromise our timehonored position in relation to war; also that they refrain from wearing the military uniform."

-Retraction of the Goshen Statement-

"A man is entitled to his opinion and to the exercise of this own conscious, but he is not always at liberty to give utterance to or exploiting his opinion or to urge his conscious on the attention of others."

Nevertheless, the disorganization and incoherent response of the Brethren leaders led to groundbreaking work by individuals like M.R. Zigler, Dan West, and Rufus Bowman who laid ground work for a cooperative plan between government and the peace churches for constructive alternative service.

As I wrap up this piece of history, you have to think of the time period (1914-1918). There were no TV's, no radios, just coming out of the horse and buggy era, no electricity, no indoor plumbing.

But you had neighbors, church, and lots of children. World events were foreign to most. Times I'm sure were tough. Some how we persevered to 2017, just about 100 years from this awful war.

We are currently getting estimates on paving the parking lot.

New South doors have been ordered and will be installed soon.

#### Christian Education Team (Ellen Fisher)

VBS was yesterday (June 10, 2017). We had a good turn out and several volunteers.

On June 25, 2017 we will have Graduation Sunday.

We are in the process of getting Bibles for 1<sup>st</sup> graders for the late summer, early fall distribution.

#### Fellowship Team (Janet Baker)

Stocks coffee in the kitchen.

Organizes greeters for weekly service.

We will be updating the church mailboxes soon.

We are planning the Ice Cream Social

We help with most meals (Town Hall, Wednesday Night Meal, etc)

#### Stewardship and Service Team (Glenn Conner given by Matt Myers)

Gift cards (over \$500.00 in value) has been given to NM School and others in need. We have assisted people in our community who have had a financial need.



Pastor Matt added that it has been a pleasure working alongside the Ministry Team (MT). He encouraged the congregation to see the MT or each individual if they have any questions/comments. Matt wished to express his Thanks to each one for all the hard work they have done.

The meeting then shifted to discuss Board topics. Brook Milburn spoke on how the Board meets regularly (generally every other week). It is still the goal of the Board to have the Constitution complete in the fall. The Governance Change document (that was passed out at the meeting, current copies on information table) will go in the constitution as well as an explanation of the changes we have made and why.

The discussion then shifted to paving the parking lot. The MT has discussed it, and the Board has approved it, so now the congregation needs to vote on if they prefer to pave it or not. It was mentioned that we do have the money to cover the fee, with money we have in savings. A comment was made by a member that if we don't pae it now it will deteriorate more. A vote by hands was taken, and an overwhelming majority agreed that we need to get it taken care of.

The meeting then went on to reflect on what has been going on here lately.

- Attendance is up, including many visitors each week.
- Budget concern now is how to spend the money, as opposed to not having the funds needed.
- Working on property maintenance.
- More community outreach
- More people getting involved (we need to push for new people to become members)
- Church has confidence in leadership
- People are encouraging the pastor
- Communication with congregation is open

The Board then encouraged the congregation to give us any feedback/questions.

Brook spoke about where our bulletin asks for us to pray for the following:

- Peace within the church
- Peace within our government
- Pray Americans find God
- Pray for God's will for us
- Pray for our MT and Board



The Board feels the prayers are working. There is once again peace in our church. We feel we are acting according to God's will. And our MT and Board feels the prayers and appreciates them.

A member asked Matt how he feels on the almost one year of being here. The following are his highlights.

Couldn't be happier

He does get some negative comments, but those are countered by positive comments and cards.

He says it is fun, but can be stressful at times.

He tries his best to make a difference.

The difficult times inspire growth.

He has seen a lot of amazing things since he has been here.

When he came as a 'pulpit fill pastor' he felt that many people ran out the door, with little fellowship after service. He jokingly said that now we need to move people along with a cattle prod as we all love to chat after service. Very strong fellowship.

He meets with area pastors and they are encouraged by what we are doing here.

North Miami is happy when he comes through the doors. Our outreach is amazing and makes a huge difference in our community. In July he wants to do a Christmas in July as we gather sweat pants for NM students in the fall.

We have to grow in the church and expand out he doors, the school and the ball field is a great beginning.

He encourages any and all feedback to be given to the MT and the Board.
