

Ukraine – Holodomor

Thought we might go to the other side of the world. A lot is known about the Holocaust that took place through Europe where Jews were hauled away to prisons, exterminated, and just shot where they lived.

About 10 years before the Holocaust, from 1931 – 1934 in the Ukraine, Stalin decided the peasants and owners of farms were not productive enough so he started the removal of the owners from their land and the ones that did not leave were starved to death, right down to finding their hiding places in their homes and even where they buried food.

The collective farms idea was for the government to own the land, have large parcels and pay the workers a meager amount of money. They were less productive and no, it did not work. All the farmers and owners were gone, either moved away or starved to death.

Stalin also wanted to stave off a Ukrainian National Movement, the Ukraine through the years has tried to be a Sovereign Nation, but where they are located wars and country take overs have plagued this country.

One of the Ukraine's problems is it has no natural borders like mountain ranges, seas, or rivers. So people just march in and take over the country.

The black earth district encompasses 2/3 of modern Ukraine. No better crops are grown anywhere, even where grain is not sown; grass is the most luxuriant in the world.

So the expulsion of the land owners and peasants was named Holodomor, Holod was Ukraine for hunger and mor was the word for extermination. From 1931 – 1934 5,000,000 people perished from hunger.

In the 1990's the Ukraine began its own government when the U.S.S.R. was failing. Little was reported on the Holodomor because the libraries, church's, town halls, were all destroyed. The U.S.S.R. always claimed the Ukrainians starved from drought or poor growing conditions.

Today, Russia is still at work taking advantage of the Ukraine. It is still the bread basket of Europe, Russia, and probably the Middle East.

I hope today that a lesson could be learned that a great economy needs a food and fiber supply that is unending.


